Luis J. Rodriguez Visits Our Redwood City Schools

Thanks to the support of the Friends, we presented best-selling author, Luis J. Rodriguez, as the featured speaker of the annual Family Author in the Schools program. Rodriguez authored the picture book, It Doesn't Have To Be This Way/ No tiene que ser así and the bestselling, Always Running, la Vida Loca, gang days in L.A. The latter is on the recommended reading list for incoming freshmen at Sequoia and Woodside. Mr. Rodriguez is an inspiring speaker who connects straight with the heart of the community. As a tireless advocate for social justice as well as a powerful writer, Mr. Rodriguez has made numerous appearances on television and radio, and has received many awards, including the "Unsung Heroes of Compassion" medal, presented by the Dalai Lama.

Rodriguez rocked the world of hundreds of RWC students during his appearances at Taft, Hoover and Woodside High as he talked about his life as a gang member and drug addict, and the difficult but ultimately successful process of leaving the life. His honesty and the power of his presence made a direct hit. He exhorted, he extolled, and a very palpable thrill went through his audience. You could hear a pin drop, even at the middle school assembly. Kids crowded around him afterward to have their pictures taken and ask questions. The students at Taft and Hoover had copies of his books, again thanks to the Friends. The looks on their faces as they lined up to meet the author and have their books signed said it all. It was a presentation they would not soon forget.
