Early Reading and Books in the Home

The Friends of the Redwood City Public Library funds the majority of the programs enjoyed by adults and children at all four of the Redwood City libraries. Without the support of the Friends, the library would not be able to offer its Summer Learning Challenge, which attracted more than 10,000 individuals during the summer of 2015, or the Winter Reading Club and its very popular VIP Winter Reading Club Party in January. The Library's Kindercard program, which provides every kindergarten student with a library card and a fantastic Super Saturday celebration, is another program funded by the Friends focused on reading and celebrating the library.

The Friends also grants the gift of literacy to the youngest members of our community. It has been said that reading is the fundamental skill for learning. Research shows that two important factors influence a child's entering school ready to read. The first involves the child being read to; the recommended number is 1,000 stories read before kindergarten. The second factor found to be crucial is the number of books owned in the home, with 10 being the minimum requirement. The Friends provides thousands of new books to children involved in the library's programs. Each of the 1,000 young children visited by a Traveling Storytime volunteer receives two new books each year. Children receive a book when they complete the Summer Learning Challenge and also the Winter Reading Club. Each month, the children who attend the Creative Crafts program receive a book related to one of the program's projects. Book giveaways are a key component of the Authors in the Schools program. The books that each child receives are treasured and shared with others, so it

The children's books for sale are in very good to new condition and are reasonably priced, with three shelves of kids' books costing only 25¢ and four more shelves of picture books and young reader books ranging from 50¢ to \$3.
